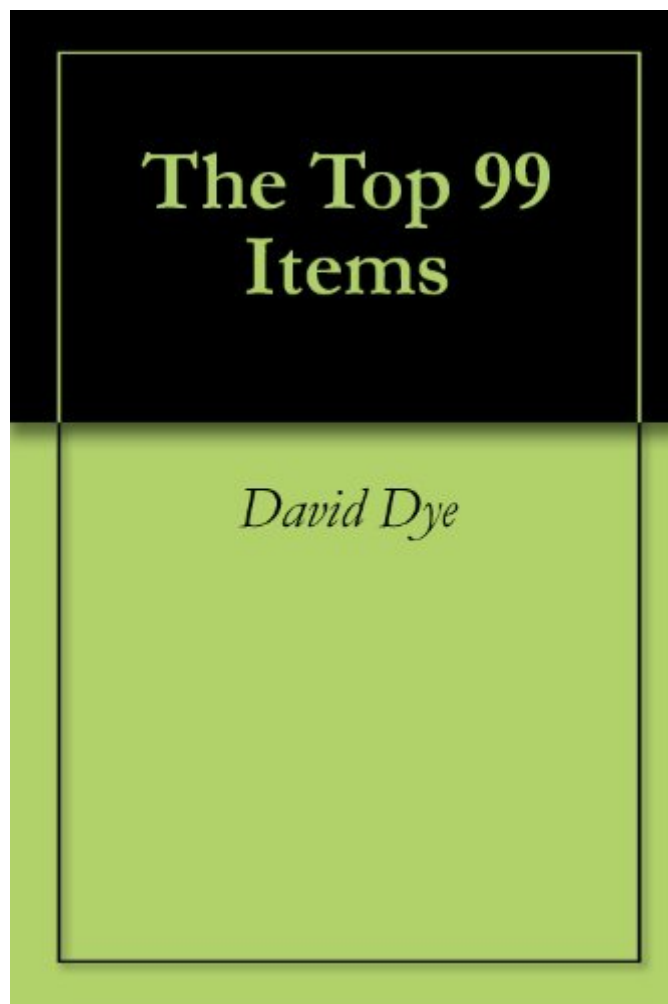

Many books are sold with expensive email and presentation systems of the top 25, or 37, or 50 items that sell out in a crisis. David Dye's book is short and to the point. He explains the reasons to store products in each category he presents, tells you the best ways to buy and store them, and recaps with a list you can print and check off as you shop. So far I have found many of the items available with coupons, at flea markets, and even craigslist, and 99 cent stores. Do not sit through a

37 minute video to pay \$37 for a list of 37 items, Buy This Book Instead!

This book should actually be called "25 items which will disappear in a crisis, and 74 more which may disappear". In spite of this, it's a good starting point, even if I disagree with the placings of many items. Personally, I believe the top 5 will be, 1) Generators, 2) Food, 3) Water, 4) Guns and ammo (certainly more than what the authors suggests, but I agree with him nevertheless), and radios. I seriously doubt washboards will be a high demand item, but there it is. One thing I like is that the author narrows his weapons choices to .22s (anyone who thinks they're gonna hunt with their weapons is kidding themselves, these are for pest control i.e. rabid dogs, cats, raccoons, etc), 9mm, and shotguns (he chooses 12 ga, but I think 20 ga will vanish as well). This makes sense, as far too many people are into a WROL (Without Rule Of Law) scenario, which is understandable, since the majority of books and movies/TV shows utilize that very scenario. The truth is that it's an extremely rare situation, it probably won't happen (only exceptions I can see are the Great Tribulation from Scripture, and a serious Martial Law scenario), and semi-auto rifles just aren't gonna be needed, except for 9mm/40 S&W subrifles. However, if you have a 223/5.56 or a 7.62x39 and are comfortable with it or you can't handle the recoil of a shotgun, then by all means keep it. Also, consider other calibers such as .380, or the .38 special (can't recommend the .357 magnum for beginners, tho) Remember, sooner or later, some semblance of law will be restored, and you WILL be held accountable for your actions. I feel like such a novice when thinking of the right things to put on my list for preparation. This at least got me started. The task seems insurmountable, but it seems lots of others do it satisfactorily. This book should assist me in becoming more prepared rather than surprised. It is in my "refer to" guidebooks for sure.

While this book did list some things to stockpile that I would not have considered, it seems that the book is an advertising primer for more books to come by this same company. Also I thought that the author tries to push certain brands of various things onto the reader, from whatever company he works for. I recommend this book as inspiration for what one might stockpile, but I would urge the reader to take the author's opinion with a metric ton of salt.

A good, basic listing, with simple explanations, of the top things one should have on hand in the event of major catastrophe of any sort. Some are evident, others less so, but he makes a good case

for them all. Of particular interest are his observations of the possible trade value of many of these items, and having a surplus of some of the simpler ones could allow you to acquire the others even if you don't already have them when TSHTF. I DO intend to keep this on my Kindle for ready reference and plan to accumulate as many of them as possible, bit by bit. I advise others to do likewise; after all, you never know what's gonna happen, and it's too late if you haven't prepped beforehand.

I liked that he included stuff that maybe wasn't on other lists, and stated his reasoning why those items made his list. Some of them I hadn't thought through, and have added to my own prepper list. Well worth the money!

Presents a reasonable list of things you might need in a SHTF situation, but it is by no means everyone's ultimate list. Rather, think of it as a place to start putting your personal list together, and as something to get you thinking of what you will really need. A little organization or grouping of similar items would make this easier to actually read & use.
