

Sylvia explains the many faces of Mother God and why She has likely been suppressed from Western culture (e.g. "history is written by the [male] conquerors").Sylvia also shares insights about "Azna" (Browne's name for the Divine Feminine) provided by her spirit guide, Francine, as well as moving stories and miracles from fellow ministers, congregants, and readers--even skeptics. Apparently, belief in Mother God seems to have no bearing on the comfort, provision, and miracles delivered to supplicants, she writes.In addition to historical facts, stories, and letters about Mother God, Sylvia also provides several prayers and meditations, in addition to answering oft-asked questions about the nature of evil and the role of Azna. For example, she answers questions about talking to Azna, why She seems to send flowers as confirmation of heard prayers, and why She is symbolized by a sword (something I've not heard of before.)After reading Father God--which left much to be desired--I didn't expect too much from the book Mother God. However, I was very much surprised at the warmth conveyed by the stories as well as Ms. Browne's obvious love for the co-Creator.
