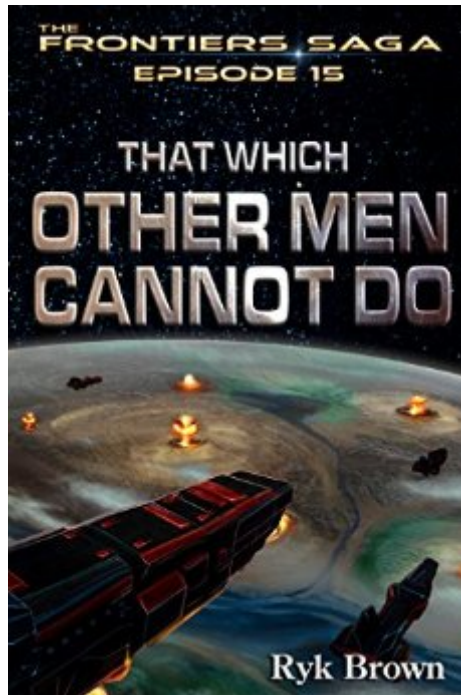

I so wanted to like this book but it was not to be. Just finished reading it and I feel let down. While the first few episodes were outstanding, the last 3-4 episodes were a huge disappointment. I disliked the episode #14 so much (Jessica was just out of control and so far off from Jessica we got to know in the earlier books that she annoyed the stuffing out of me) that the only reason I bought

this episode is that I thought it would be the conclusion of the series. It is not!! Cliffhangers suck! Beside the fact that I didn't like the ending (both as the storyline and the nature of the ending), there are few other things that I have an issue with in this episode. 1.) The fact that there is no "break" between different POVs in the same battlefield got rather confusing very quickly since there could be up to 5 different POV in any one scene. Keep catching myself rereading the sentences just so my brain can catch up with my eyes and sort out that we've moved the dialogue on to another ship/planet. 2.) Jessica is still having meltdowns.... I just find it hard to believe that a person in her position could behave in such manner without being removed/reprimanded for her behaviour. To be fair, Nathan did "have a chat" with her but that's about it. 3.) I found Admiral Galiardi to be unbelievable as a character. 4.) What happened with the scene after Commander Telles orders Josh and Loki to take additional Falcons to search by grid for the shuttle? Did they get recalled? Did they even start? It goes straight from the orders to a different scene and never gets mentioned again... 5.) Where was Commander Telles in the last scenes? Since his primary programming is to protect Captain Scott, why wasn't he on the Aurora at the end of the episode?
