

The impending launch of Resource Description and Access: RDA will undoubtedly transform cataloging standards that have been virtually unchanged for 30 years, and little guidance is available to help catalogers make a smooth transition to RDA. The authors also explain the MARC21 record, studying tags, indicators, and sub-field codes.
