

the most part, I have found Aunt Tillie's antics and curses funny. However, personally, I thought that the curse involving blindness was over the top and just plain mean spirited. Moreover, to make someone blind while they are at the top of the stairs where they could have fallen and been injured or killed was heartless and simply anything but funny. If the author isn't careful she may find that there are more readers who dislike Aunt Tillie and/or think that her curses are cruel rather than funny than those who like her and/or find her antics humorous. I know that the witches, including the victims, made a joke about the incident at the end of the story but I still didn't find this particular curse funny. Maybe it's just me and I'm being over sensitive.
