

There were far too many typos and grammatical errors. Couldn't someone have proofread this before publishing it? Also, I am a Renewalite myself (I credit Reb Zalman's teachings with bringing me back to Judaism roughly 20 years ago), but I find myself disagreeing with some of the author's conclusions. For me, the most important aspect of Renewal has been its spiritual intensity and focus

on bringing Judaism's mystical current to the forefront, not so much the social activism which the author stresses. Moreover, I think the author badly missteps when he suggests that Renewal become merely a think tank for creativity for the rest of Judaism. If "small is [indeed] beautiful," then Renewal should be content with being small, yet powerful, and forge ahead on all of the fronts it has already pioneered.
