

In his fifth forensics nonfiction work, Macavity Award-winning D.P. Lyle answers "morbidly curious questions" from crime writers. The California cardiologist's debut nonfiction book was Edgar-nominated FORENSICS FOR DUMMIES. Nonetheless, Lyle is no stranger to fiction. His six novels include the Dub Walker series, following HOT LIGHTS, COLD STEEL. Lyle also served as consultant to the writers of Law & Order, CSI: Miami, and House.Lyle separates fact from fiction

when questioned if a serial killer nurse could inject air to kill a victim. Surprisingly, about a cup of air "would travel into the right side of the heart and block its pumping action." Answering if a heated branding iron applied to a victim could cause death, Lyle provides gruesome details about pain that would be incurred but death is unlikely. "Unless the victim died of shock induced by the severe pain, that is."Questions from writers who want their characters to suffer gunshot wounds or cardiac-like events are categorized and answered with facts and possible scenarios for the authors. Lyle expresses wit with his opinion about a fictional killer that suffers from "paranoid schizophrenia with delusional and psychotic components." Such a person hears voices or feels bugs crawling over him, has a break with reality. "He sounds like an interesting character, but I hope you off him by the end of your tale."For a historical scenario, Lyle offers suggestions about murder methods other than poison in the 1800s. "But what about a hatpin? She could stab the victim in the chest and damage the heart. Or she could drive the hatpin into the victim's ear canal. It would enter the brain and could kill him instantly.
