This book has me speechless. I have read a ton of Wyrmish literature put out by White Wolf in my time, including the Book of the Wyrm, and I must say that I learned more from this book than all the rest. This is truely one excellent book and a great prop to have around. The only reason this book did not receive 5 stars from me was because of the rather dry Victorian story about the paranormal investigator, but the typed report in the back nearly makes up for it...

The Chronicle is the best fake grimoire of evil sorcery I've ever seen! The Simon Necronomicon looks like a kid's book by comparison. Graphically cool, mentally twisted, and a fine pastiche of what a real system of dangerous magic might look like. I assume that gamers will like it, but I've never played Werewolf: The Apolcalypse, and I loved it!

This is a fake book meant to be used as a prop in the Werewolf: The Apocalypse/White-Wolf Role-playing game; which i have never looked into but this book is very interesting! Really cool
