

These learned and insightful papers provide us with a non-fundamentalist way to apply the resources of Jewish law and ethics to modern day dilemmas. The book states that "In the Jewish tradition, the central means of addressing these concerns is through halakhah, or Jewish law. The second division, "Responsibilities for Fetal Life," contains papers on abortion.
