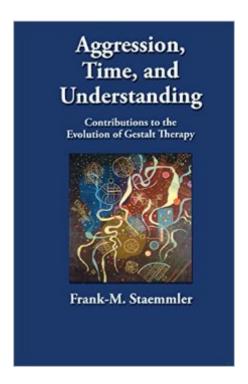

If Perls Hefferline and Goodman were writing today, they would be Staemmler, Perls, Hefferline and

Goodman. This book makes what might be the most significant revision to gestalt therapy theory ever. In book-length section one Staemmler corrects an egregious error that both gestalt therapy and psychoanalysis have at their foundations -- a conflation of assertiveness with aggression. Not only does Staemmler correct this error, but he also provides fresh, new insight on how to deal with aggression when it does arise in therapy. His revised theory also finally allows for the meaningful integration of Eastern thought in gestalt psychotherapy, something PHG attempted in 1951, but never really pulled off. The remaining sections of the book are interesting but do not make the earth move in the same way as the first -- aftershocks to section one's 10.0 on the Richter scale. Buy this book now. It changes everything.

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
